Authors of three new books address issues critical to the future of American Jewry, challenging assumptions about communal diversity, Jewish identity and baby boomers. In *How Jewish Communities Differ*, Ira Sheskin presents some of the major results of 45 studies conducted over the past 20 years. Uzi Rebhun documents in *Migration, Community and Identification: Jews in Late 20th Century America*, that Jewish identification has shifted from consistent religious behavior and participation in the public sphere to more intermittent and home-centered activities in the private sphere. And Chaim I. Waxman in *The Lonely Baby Boomer Crowd and the Organized Jewish Community* argues that the Baby Boomers feelings about Jewishness and their religious behavior have major ramifications for the organized Jewish community, and suggests some new ways in which the community can engage this group.
